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

1. INTRODUCTION

In this report, we will accumulate, analyse and summarise the results from the internal and external quality evaluations done during August 2021 – December 2021 of the HEALING project.

The elements that were identified and evaluated during the above period of the project were:

- Partnership meetings evaluations
- Event evaluations
- Training Evaluations
- Courses evaluations

2. POST MEETINGS' EVALUATIONS: AIMS AND PROCEDURES

The post-meetings evaluations among project partners, aimed to measure mainly the effectiveness of the partnership meetings. After each meeting, a meeting evaluation survey must be conducted. In each survey, each partner's project representatives rate the meeting in a questionnaire, using Google Forms for the distribution to the partners.

The questionnaire used for these surveys consists of 13 questions, grouped into 3 sections, 10 of which are closed questions on 5-point Likert scale, where respondents have to give a grade between 1 and 5, with 5 being the highest (Fully Agree) and 1 the lowest (Fully Disagree), as well as 3 open-ended questions.

At the end of the questionnaire respondents are asked to declare their organisation, for the purpose of ascertaining partner participation.

During the project various online meetings have been organized in order to discuss the monitoring of progress towards completion of the deliverables and of the assigned Tasks. These short meetings that aimed to discuss specific topics have not undergone an evaluation. Overall, the meetings that have been held from the beginning of the project till present are 12.

2.1 Teleconference management meeting (28 September 2021)

The survey was conducted amongst those who attended the Teleconference meeting that was held on September 28, 2021. A questionnaire was prepared and was delivered to the partners through Google Forms.




Figure 1. Number of surveys submitted (N=18)

Partners submitted their answers during the period from September 29th, 2021 to October 1st, 2021. **18** responses were received, coming from all partners. This is illustrated in Figure 1.

The responses given by the participants are analysed below.

2.1.1 Analysis of scaled questions




Figure 2: Analysis of responses on 1-5 scale for the project meeting evaluation ("The Meeting")








Figure 3: Analysis of responses on 1-5 scale for the project meeting evaluation ("The Project after the Meeting")

The responses received can be found below in Table 1 and in Figures 2 and 3. Most participants responded with a positive reply, marking the responses as Agree (26%), and Fully Agree (65%) overall, for both sections. On average there was 91% agreement with the statements of the 2 sections, well above the appointed 70% threshold, suggesting that participants were overall satisfied with the effectiveness of the project meeting.

In the first section of questions, about the Meeting itself, the answers favour mostly the highest rate (Fully Agree, 67%) while Agree is at 27%. A very small percentage (6%) is Neutral and (1%) Disagree.

In the second section of questions about the perception of the Project after the meeting, the response rates are mostly Fully Agree (63%) and Agree (24%) responses, while a percentage (13%) is Neutral and (1%) Disagree.

As we can see from the graphs, one "Disagree" response received the following questions: "Partners were able to interact with other project's partners." and "The timescales proposed are realistic and feasible".

In all questions, the number of responses "Fully Agree" statement dominate over the "Agree" responses.

2.1.2 Open ended questions

In this section of the questionnaire, we asked partners about their perception of the effectiveness of the meeting to solve problems and questions, as well future obstacles. It must be noted that the following analysis concerns specific responses received, since most questions were either remained unanswered or received a general response.

The following element is still a major concern to me:

Many of respondents of this question either did not answer or gave a general answer (14/18 answers). The specific received responses are the following:

Some people still didn't produce the lectures even though the deadline was more than 2 months ago.

W2 needs more time to be finished.

Face to Face meetings are needed.

The finalization of the clusters.



Suggestions and aspects to be improved:

Many of respondents of this question either did not answer or gave a general answer (14/18 answers). The specific received responses are the following:

We absolutely need to have a calendar where the events of the next three-four months are indicated. The No. of duties is very high, and I have to plan events well ahead in order to be present. At the moment, it happens too frequently that requests for seminars or presentations come out of the blue.

Preparing courses "in detail" would not seem very comfortable for the majority of partners, especially for Tunisians, who will give these courses in French. We could have been satisfied with the titles of the chapters and the titles of the paragraphs that we must develop subsequently.

Physical meeting and trainings.

Leave more time between the discussion of Work Packages for discussion among partners and questions.

Are there any additional comments you would like to make regarding the project?

The only closing additional comment received, repeated the need of physical meetings.

2.2 Physical management meeting (18-19 November 2021)

The survey was conducted amongst those who attended the meeting that was held on November 18-19, 2021 in Porto. A questionnaire was prepared and was delivered to the partners through Google Forms.




Figure 4. Number of surveys submitted (N=8)

Partners submitted their answers during the period from November 19th, 2021 to December 2nd, 2021. **8** responses were received, coming from all partners. This is illustrated in Figure 4.

The responses given by the participants are analysed below.

2.2.1 Analysis of scaled questions




Figure 5: Analysis of responses on 1-5 scale for the project meeting evaluation ("The Meeting")






Figure 6: Analysis of responses on 1-5 scale for the project meeting evaluation ("The Project after the Meeting")

The responses received can be found below in Table 2 and in Figures 5 and 6. Most participants responded with a positive reply, marking the responses as Agree (17%), and Fully Agree (61%) overall, for both sections. On average there was 86% agreement with the statements of the 2 sections, above the appointed 70% threshold, suggesting that participants were overall satisfied with the effectiveness of the project meeting.

In the first section of questions, about the Meeting itself, the answers favour mostly the highest rate (Fully Agree, 59%) while Agree is at 17%. A percentage 16% is Neutral, 2% Disagree and 6% Fully Disagree.

In the second section of questions about the perception of the Project after the meeting, the response rates are mostly Fully Agree (66%). Agree and Neutral responses is 16%, while a percentage 3% is Fully Disagree.

As we can see from the graphs, one "Disagree" response received the following question: "The conference room and its facilities facilitated the work during the meeting." while the following 5 questions received Fully Disagree responses: "The meeting was well planned and organised.", "The agenda was balanced, focusing on all key aspects of the project.", "The timetable was respected.", "The access to the venue of the meeting was easy." and the "The timescales proposed are realistic and feasible.".

In all questions, the number of responses "Fully Agree" statement dominate over the "Agree" and "Neutral" responses.

2.2.2 Open ended questions

In this section of the questionnaire, we asked partners about their perception of the effectiveness of the meeting to solve problems and questions, as well future obstacles. It must be noted that the following analysis concerns specific responses received, since most questions were either remained unanswered or received a general response.

The following element is still a major concern to me:

Many of respondents of this question either did not answer or gave a general answer (6/8 answers). The specific received responses are the following:

Respect of time, having activities in 2 locations very far one day.



Give more interest to practical activities in art therapy bringing together Experts and beneficiaries

Suggestions and aspects to be improved:

Many of respondents of this question either did not answer or gave a general answer (7/8 answers). The specific received response is the following. It is a response that was also mentioned in the previous question:

Give more interest to practical activities in art therapy bringing together Experts and beneficiaries

Are there any additional comments you would like to make regarding the project?

The only closing additional comment received stated that the workshops and the schedule were very busy, which makes the training a bit tiring for all participants.

3. TRAINING EVALUATION

All Training workshops/seminars undergo an internal evaluation process by the participants/trainees. After the end of the training, each participant is asked to rate several aspects of the training in a questionnaire (using hardcopies or Google Forms). The questionnaires include closed questions as well as open-ended questions for remarks, comments and suggestions.

The questionnaire used consists of 4 sections. The 1st section (Overall training experience) contains 13 closed questions (in case of online training the questions are 10) on 5-point Likert scale, where respondents have to give a grade between 1 and 5, with 5 being the highest (Fully Agree) and 1 the lowest (Fully Disagree). The 2nd section (Opinion of the Trainers) contains 5 closed questions on 5-point Likert scale, where respondents have to give a grade between 1 and 5, with 5 being the highest (Fully Agree) and 1 the lowest (Fully Disagree). The 3rd section contains one closed Yes/No question asking if the training was appropriate for the level of experience of the participant. The 4th section contains 3 open-ended questions regarding: Topics that were not or insufficiently covered – Topics not relevant to the training – Best part of the training.

Room for suggestions or comments for making the program more effective was also made available.

Respondents are asked to declare their organisation, for the purpose of ascertaining partner participation.



3.1 Training Workshop on 15-19 November in Porto

A questionnaire was prepared and was delivered to all the participants through Google Forms after the training that was held with physical presence on November 15 - 19, 2021 by the Universidade Católica Portuguesam, UCP in Porto.

16 responses were received. In the figure below you may find the position of the participants.




Figure 7. Position of participants (N=16)

The responses given by the participants are analysed below.

3.1.1 Analysis of scaled questions




Figure 8. Analysis of responses on 1-5 scale for the Overall Training experience






Figure 9. Analysis of responses on 1-5 scale for the opinion of the trainers/presenters

The responses received can be found below in Figures 8, 9 and 10 and Table 3. Most participants responded with a positive reply, marking the responses as Agree (36%), and Fully Agree (47%) overall, for both sections. On average there was 82% agreement with the statements of the 2 sections, above the appointed 70% threshold, suggesting that participants were overall satisfied with the effectiveness of the training webinar and the trainers.



In the first section of questions, about the overall experience about training, the majority of the answers are Fully Agree (44%) and Agree (38%). All questions have received at least one "Neutral", "Disagree" and "Fully Disagree" statement.

In the second section of questions about the participants' opinion of the trainers/presenters, the response rates are mostly Fully Agree (53%) and Agree (31%) responses, while a 4% percentage is Neutral, a very small percentage replied Disagree (1%) and a 11% percentage is Fully Disagree. All statements have received at least one Fully Disagree response.

Finally all participants agreed that the training was appropriate for their level of experience.

By analyzing the rates the questions received, we observe that all questions have a range from 1-5.

By analysing the weighted averages for each question on both sections, we observe that the lowest rated question was "The training was well planned and organized." (73%), whereas the highest result came for the questions "The study tours were useful and had an added value in the whole training", "The training enhanced my understanding on the subject" and "The training will be useful to me and my professional growth" (86%).

3.1.2 Open ended questions

In this section of the questionnaire, participants were asked to write suggestions or opinions about any of the aspects covered in the other questions or about issues not yet analysed. It must be noted that the following analysis concerns specific responses received, since most questions were either remained unanswered or received a general response.

Which topics were not covered or insufficiently covered, in your opinion?

Many of respondents of this question either did not answer or gave a general answer (13/16 answers). The following analysis concerns the specific received responses.

The responses on this question show that the topics that were insufficient covered was Musictherapy and Culture activities. One participant stated that the stakeholders were not well defined.

Which topics were not relevant in your opinion?

Many of respondents of this question either did not answer or gave a general answer (11/16 answers). The following analysis concerns the specific received responses.

The responses on this question show that the topics that were not relevant were: Clinical diagnosis and Cluster of drama therapy.

One participant stated that there was no need to focus on healthy patients.

Moreover, according to a participant's opinion the visit of Cleanic X, the lecture of the active learning and the visit of the engineering school, didn't provide an added value.

Finally one participant wishes to have more information and time about the Music therapy lesson.



What did you like best about the training?

The majority of respondents of this question gave an answer (11/16 answers). The specific received responses are the following:

The visits to therapy centers and institutions, real cases, community center (6 responses)

Part therapy training (2 responses)

Interaction with participants

The diversity of learning activities, visits, and lectures

Methodology of presentation

What suggestions or comments do you have for making the program more effective?

Most of respondents of this question answer on this question (11/16 answers). The specific answers that we received are the following:

To planning all sessions in the same place and for one session per day

More practical experience Art therapy applications

More interaction of participants

Use a language that can be understandable by all

To have social events

Expand the program one day plus (supported day)

Multidisciplinary formation

Well organize the meeting by providing more facilities to participants: (1) Select one meeting place by day, (2) Do not change the program or the meeting place at the night, (3) organize cultural activities and a visit of the city, (4) The local partner can help the participants by providing an updated schedule of buses: We lose a lot of times in buses during these days.

Avoid overlapping scheduling for trainers and STC members

Strengthen the practical aspect

Leave some time for visit the city and go around



4. EVENT EVALUATION

All Events/workshops undergo an internal evaluation process by the participants. After the end of the event, each participant is asked to rate the event in a questionnaire (using hardcopies or Google Forms). The questionnaires include closed questions as well as an open-ended question for remarks, comments and suggestions.

The questionnaire used consists of 1 section which contains approximately 9 closed questions. There is a base questionnaire regarding all event evaluations. Nevertheless, some questions are adjusted to the type, topic and scope of each event.

At the beginning of the questionnaire respondents are asked to declare their organisation, for the purpose of ascertaining partner participation.

4.1 WP3.4 Creative Arts Therapy 2nd Online Workshop (19.10.2021)

A questionnaire was prepared and was delivered to the participants through Google Forms after the workshop that was organized by the University College Leuven Limburg (UCLL) in cooperation with the University of Jordan (UJ) on 19 October 2021.

HEALING Project staff from the school of arts shared their experiences and knowledge of how the arts can be used in different cultural and medical settings through conducted creative Art therapy (2) training workshop which was held within the art therapy project series of training workshops via ZOOM.

The main objective after introducing the project aim which is to represent and encourage the development of Arts Therapy education in partner countries and its expected outcomes is to introduce the trainees about the importance of art therapy in their lives, which was mediated by movement and its role in relieving tension and anxiety that effectively control the life of society.

24 responses were received coming from a variety of universities from Jordan and Tunisia.

4.1.1 Analysis of scaled questions




Figure 11: Analysis of responses on 1-5 scale for the Overall workshop experience

The responses received can be found below in Figure 11 and Table 4. Participants responded with a positive reply, marking the responses as Agree (45%), and Strongly Agree (49%), well above the appointed 70% threshold, suggesting that participants were overall satisfied with the effectiveness of the workshop.

All questions received from one to four "Neutral" responses. The most "Neutral" responses (4 responses) come for the questions: The length of workshop was sufficient.

By analyzing the rates the questions received, we observe that all questions have a range from 3-5.



By analysing the weighted averages for each question on both sections, we observe that the lowest rated questions were "The workshop met my expectations." and "The chosen teleconference platform was suitable." (87%), whereas the highest result came for the question "The presenters' communication style kept me interested" (91%).

4.2 Clustering Online Workshop (October 11th - 13th, 18th - 19th 2021)

A questionnaire was prepared and was delivered to the participants through Google Forms after the workshop that was organized on 11, 12, 13, 18 and 19 October 2021.

The 5-days online workshop conducted to expose the faculty members from JO and TU partners to all 19 Clusters in the field of Art Therapy. The workshop aimed to disseminate the Clusters teaching materials and to give an overview among all partners and future trainers. For all Clusters the following were presented:

- Introduction (Brief review on cluster, committee members, Environment of work to prepare the teaching lectures.
- Full review on Contents, who can teach this cluster, number of Lectures, references, other teaching resources.

62 responses were received coming from all partners' organisations.



4.2.1 Analysis of scaled questions




Figure 12: Analysis of responses on 1-5 scale for the Overall workshop experience

The responses received can be found below in Figure 12 and Table 5. Participants responded with a positive reply, marking the responses as Agree (45%), and Fully Agree (42%), well above the appointed 70% threshold, suggesting that participants were overall satisfied with the effectiveness of the workshop.

All questions have a range from 1-5.

All questions received from two to nine "Neutral" responses. The most "Neutral" responses come for the questions: The amount of time needed to complete this course is appropriate for this content.

Moreover, all questions have received from one to six "Disagree" and "Fully Disagree" responses. The six responses were Fully Disagree and come for the questions: The agenda of the event was appropriate and The duration of the event was satisfactory.

By analysing the weighted averages for each question on both sections, we observe that the lowest rated questions were "The agenda of the event was appropriate" and "The duration of the event was satisfactory." (81%), whereas the highest result came for the question "I feel that the event achieved its objective to introduce participants to the different clusters and sub-clusters organisation", "The content adequately explains the concepts it presents" (86%).

In many clusters examples and assessments were presented. 73% participants answered that the examples used help gain a clearer understanding of the content, while 71% stated that the assessments used are sequenced, varied, and suited to the level of the course.




Figure 13: Analysis of responses on Yes-No-N/A scale for the examples, if presented and their usefulness




Figure 14: Analysis of responses on Yes-No-N/A scale for the assessments, if presented, and their appropriateness

5. COURSES EVALUATION

Courses that are identified as key in the Quality Plan Spreadsheet underwent an internal evaluation process by the partners not involved in their development. Each cluster has been evaluated by one partner, who rated the deliverable in a questionnaire, using Google Forms.

The questionnaire used consists of 3 sections:

The 1st section (1.Assessment of Deliverable by the Reviewer) consists of 12 closed questions, on 4-point Likert scale, where respondents have to give an answer between Excellent – Good – Fair and Poor.

The 2nd section (Suggested improvements on the above questions) concerns possible changes that should be implemented - Missing information - Further improvements - Minor corrections that need attention.

The last section (3. Conclusion) gives 3 options: A. Deliverable accepted; no changes required, B. Deliverable needs minor revision, C. Deliverable needs major revision (resubmit).



Room for general observations and suggestions was also made available.

At the end of the questionnaire the reviewer was asked to declare their name and organization.

5.1 Evaluation analysis of 19 Courses

Healing project aims at developing innovative and multidisciplinary techniques that respond to the target group's educational needs, challenges, and required art therapy education skills. Surveys were carried out to identify students' requests and needs. From this field work, a list of courses has been proposed suitable for all partners' institutions. These courses support the establishing a multidisciplinary diploma on Art therapy in the higher education institutions in Jordan and Tunisia base on a course cluster structure.

19 courses have been developed for the HEALING project. Each course has been evaluated by one partner who has not been involved in its development. The results of the evaluation of the courses can be seen in the following table.
