The TOT training week in Belgium took place from Monday 17 to Friday 21 October.

On day 1, participants were welcomed in Leuven at UCLL's Campus. Here, all participants had the chance to introduce themselves to get to know each other better and thus also learn about the expertise and background of the other participants.

Chloe Mentens, researcher at UCLL, provided a welcome presentation where the participants

were welcomed, given practical information about their stay in Belgium and the planning of

the coming days but also some facts and background about the university centre UCLL and

how education is organised in Flanders.

Next, researcher Ellen Muller (UCLL) gave an introduction about Belgium using an interactive

quiz.

After the coffee break, a workshop was organised by Ruben Jans, lecturer and researcher at

UCLL. The topic was the organisation of European education and the associated ECTS

system. Explicit attention was paid to how a similar system can be applied to, among other

things, the healing training or other training offered by the participating partners.

In the afternoon, two more sessions were arranged.

The first session in the afternoon was presented by Dr Ir Patrick De Maziere, Head of Digital

Solutions. He gave a session on Technology Enhanced Care, inspiring initiatives at the

intersection between care and science. How can modern technology play a role in care and

in what way does art and creativity play an important role in Belgium right now among care

providers. The session ended with an open discussion where cultural differences and

difference in applications were discussed among the participants, followed by a coffee break.

The final session of the first day was facilitated by ms. Joyce Raie, head of faculty of theatre

arts. This was an active session around movement therapy focusing on different aspects of

self-care.

On the second day, TOT staff week participants gathered in the centre of Leuven as the first session took place in the city. We gathered on the main market at an architecturally (and functionally) important building for the city; the town hall. We walked in group to the 'Romaanse Poort'. This was the starting point of the guided walk, Guided by recognised city guide and cultural expert Marc Bracke. He toured us through the city, stopping at several stops that had significant significance in the medical or cultural history of the city of Leuven. Art and therapy are fields in which Leuven has national and international fame. Among other things, we visited the college, the art library, the herb garden where Vesalius, among others, used to teach about the early years of medicine, and so on. We enjoyed the anecdotes and took the time afterwards to ask questions which led to an interesting group discussion about the approach to art therapy in different countries and what important role Leuven played in putting this topic on the map in Europe.

The second session of day two was scheduled to share the principles of music therapy among the participants. Afterwards, we were able to enjoy lunch together.

In the afternoon, Ruben Jans, Teacher - researcher - learning technologist, taught a session on Augumented reality in (Health) education. He presented a 360 tool to integrate practice knowledge into therapy lessons in an accessible way. As a practical example, we were given an online tour of the University Hospital of Leuven and got an insight into how medical education was implemented using Augumented Reality. We were also allowed to experiment with the tool ourselves by applying it to our own expertise in order to inspire each other with the possibilities and applications.

Closing the second day we did with a continuation of movement therapy by ms. Joyce Raie.

Various intercultural snacks and dishes were offered, concluded with a fresh tea ceremony. The activity allowed ucll professionals and project partners to exchange experiences about their careers but also learn more about each other's culture and customs.

Afterwards, we could enjoy the goodies we made together during an interesting lecture by Prof Laura Pauwels. She gave a lecture on COILS and internationalisation within courses. She presented some best practices but also let the group work on their own through short brainstorming sessions on possible topics for collaborative online international learning and blended intensive programmes.

The group meets again at UCLL's campus building in Leuven. The first session is reserved for Dr Rasmieh Amar on group psychology. In some creative and out of the box assignments, she will take the group through the theme of group psychology. The group discussions reveal how we can become aware of communication, peer pressure and a social hierarchy that sets up within a group.

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After the coffee break, it was time for a session by Prof Leen Vennekens Lecturer UCLL Bachelor of Orthopedagogy, Master of Communication Sciences and expert on body language and drama. She gave an interactive talk on her theatre project KATVIS. It is an example of what is the power of integrating arts and culture in higher education. Afterwards, there was an exchange of ideas on why it is important to integrate art in different course units.

At 12.15 it was time for a short session on music therapy. What does music therapy mean according to the various attendees and how can music therapy be an added value within existing therapy.

afternoon we are welcomed by dr andy veltjen, his expertise is covering the fields of e-learning, blended learning, mobile learning, gaming and social networks, like e.g. the use of Facebook for informal learning or using games to motivate students. He's working on a variety of projects in many sectors like e.g. healthcare, politics, entertainment, education, labor market, e.a.... He delivered a session on technology-enhanced learning in healtcare. More specifically on how technology can support healthcare providers in preventing delirium but also the great role gamification and creativity in emerging sizes embodies in the research domain of healthcare.

After the coffee break, we will again conclude with an interactive creative session given by Dr Rasmieh Amar, this time on the theme of ethics more specifically the importance of ethics, open discussions and public opinion to make sensitive topics discussable.

On the last day, we are guests at a special location, namely the internationally renowned Sint Luca School of arts. Here we will be welcomed by Bart Meuris, coordinator Internationalization LUCA-Music and Jos De Backer professor and coordinator of the Bachelor and Master training in music therapy at LUCA and head of the music therapy department at the University Psychiatric Center KU Leuven. He is an internationally recognised principal investigator (PI), widely known for his work on musical improvisation within a therapeutic context. His research mainly focuses on therapeutic processes with persons with psychiatric problems (psychosis, personality disorders, dementia) and persons with a mental disability and autism.

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Meuris and De Backer gave us a tour of the buildings of Sint Luca school of art and research.

At 10 am, we get to participate in an improvisation session on music painting in collaboration with some musicians and teachers from the Sint Luca School of Arts.

After this, we are invited by Prof Dr Katrien Foubert in a lecture on the current state of art of music therapy in Europe. Prof Foubert holds a master's degree in music (violin) from the Conservatoire de Bruxelles, and a master's degree in music therapy from LUCA School of Arts. During her doctoral and postdoctoral studies, she developed innovative methods to include musical interaction in psychiatric diagnostic and therapeutic assessments in patients with personality or autism spectrum disorders. Currently, her research focuses on the study of musical-improvisational processes in relation to mental health and psychopathology.

To also interact and get to know the students of Sint Luca, we were allowed to participate in an improvisation session where we engaged in musical conversation with the attendees.

At the end, we were allowed to visit the chapel of Sint Luca college as a surprise. Here we were given a private concert on the recently renovated pipe organ.

To end the week, we held a closing moment at UCLL where the certificates were handed out and there was room to evaluate the week.
