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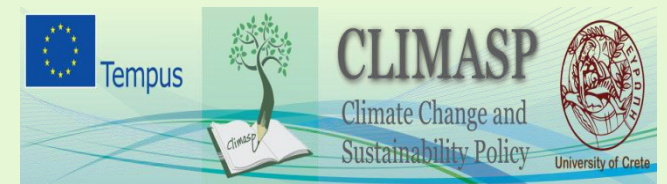

What is CLIMASP Project?

Is a European Commission TEMPUS funded project entitled “Development of an Interdisciplinary Program in Climate Change and Sustainability Policy” that is being designed and implemented across 10 universities in Egypt, Jordan and Lebanon. The CLIMASP project is coordinated by the University of Crete, Greece through its UNESCO Chair ICT in Education for Sustainable Development.

CLIMASP program gives you the opportunity to earn a Euro-Arab pass Diploma in climate change and sustainability policy in addition to the bachelor’s degree granted to you within your specialty.

Main Objective

The focus of the interdisciplinary program CLIMASP is to address the issue of climate change and sustainability policy from an environmental, social, economic, cultural and political perspective, with regional reference. It aims to transform the current unsustainable practices and promote interdisciplinary collaboration in the partner countries universities.

1. Develop capacity-building workshops for building interdisciplinary and multi-stakeholder driven climate change curricula responsive to societal needs
2. Develop an undergraduate interdisciplinary program in climate change and sustainability policy (CLIMASP) in each partner country university

4. Contextualize the Europass supplement diploma in the partner universities and the region
