



Antoaneta Radocaj Jerkovic

Associate Professor, Vice-Dean for Students and Education.

Dr. Antoaneta Radocaj-Jerkovic is university professor, choral conductor and singer from Croatia. She holds graduate and postgraduate degrees in Voice, Music Pedagogy and Choral Pedagogy. Professor Radocaj-Jerkovic received her doctorate degree in Pedagogy (choral pedagogy) at the Faculty of Humanities in Zagreb.

She is Associate Professor at the Academy of Arts and Culture in Osijek where she teaches music arts in the field of music reproduction and conducting for the Choir courses. Since 2008, she also holds the post of Vice-Dean for Education.

She has trained artistically in Musical Pedagogy, Conducting and Singing at the Westminster Choir College in Princeton, Eastman School of Music (USA), Internationales Chorleiterseminar (Germany).

As a conductor, she has held numerous concerts both in Croatia and abroad: Hungary, Serbia, Bosnia and Herzegovina, Bulgaria, Greece, Austria, Germany, Sweden, China, Canada, Italy, Poland, Russia, USA and Australia. A particularly significant international achievement is seen in her conducting a concert at Carnegie Hall in New York in 2013 and in Sydney Opera House in 2017. She has received over thirty international awards and acknowledgements. Dr. Radocaj-Jerkovic has released 12 solo audio and video records and her recordings are on some 10 compilation albums as well as audio material for primary school musical textbooks. She published two books about choral and vocal arts, she is sought-after jury member at national and international choral competitions

and she regularly presents her work and holds workshops at national and international conferences.
